"THIS court ought not to be in session at all today," Judge Martin J. Wade said when U. S. district court opened here this morning. In fact, the entire state is paying tribute to Judge P. B. Wolfe, one of Iowa's most respected, loyal and sincere jurists.

Judge Wolfe, who died at his home in Clinton Sunday afternoon, was buried in Calvary cemetery, Clinton, this morning. Judge Wade stated that ordinarily district court would have been adjourned here out of respect for Judge Wolfe, but that the pressure of business made such an adjournment impossible.

Expect Many Applications for Examinations in Davenport.

A number of Civil Service examinations for which he expects numerous applicants are announced by Albert Pfalzgraf, in charge of examinations here, this morning.

Headed the list of examinations is that for assistant editor of "Work in Industry" a government publication. The position carries with it a salary of from \$2,100 to \$2,700. The quiz will be held here June 21.
