Richard W. Wolfe Is Appointed National Treasurer.

CHICAGO, July 11 (AP). — Richard W. Wolfe of Chicago was named today as national treasurer of the new Union party which Representative William Lemke will lead in the Fall Presidential race.

Mr. Wolfe held the same office in the third party campaign made by the elder Robert LaFollette, Wisconsin Progressive, in 1924. His selection was announced by Mr. Lemke, here to set up the Union party's headquarters.

Mr. Lemke said the party's Fall drive would be financed through the sale of "charter membership certificates" to all who contributed \$1 or more.
